North American Mite-A-Thon: August 14th-29th Mite-A-Thon is a tri-national effort to collect mite infestation data and to visualize Varroa infestations in honev bee colonies across North America within a two week window. All beekeepers can participate, creating a rich distribution of sampling sites in Canada, the United States, and Mexico. Their Varroa monitoring data will be uploaded to www.mitecheck.com. The parasitic mite, Varroa destructor (Varroa), and the viruses it vectors is a significant driver of this honey bee colony mortality. Yet, indicators suggest that many beekeepers are not monitoring honey bee colony Varroa infestations and therefore not able to connect infestation to colony loss. **OBJECTIVE: 1)** To raise awareness about honey bee colony Varroa infestations in North America through effective monitoring methods. 2) Management strategies will be made available for discussion within bee organizations utilizing Mite-A-Thon partner developed information and outreach materials. DATA COLLECTION: Participants will monitor the level of mites (number of mites per 100 bees) using a standardized protocol utilizing two common methods of assessment (alcohol wash or powdered sugar roll) and then enter data, including location, total number of hives. number of hives tested, local habitat, and the number of Varroa mites counted from each hive. The published information will not identify individual participants. https://www.pollinator.org/miteathon

Hey Beeks!

Hope you are having a great summer so far. I talked about honey at the last meeting, and that is always fun. As usual, I talked too long and got the hook! And that was OK as Joan followed me and talked about mite treatments, which are critical at this time of year.

Varroa mites are the biggest threat I see to Honey bees over-wintering successfully. Many beekeepers, new and experienced alike, wait too long to do something about mite loads in their colonies. The bees look so strong and have tons of honey and they just figure they are fine...But, as we used to say in the Navy, *"you get what you inspect, not what you expect".*

Taking mite counts during April, May, and June are important, as you can see what the progression of the mite load on your colonies is and treat as necessary. If you haven't done that, you really don't know which of your colonies will become really stressed in July and August. Those are the critical months when the mite counts soar, as the queen cuts back on laying and the bee population starts to moderate and then slowly decrease as the nectar dearth sets in. The mites don't cut back on their population growth when the bees do. They just keep increasing. The rising mite population and the declining bee population causes the percentage of mites to increase exponentially. Just when the bees need young healthy bees to feed the winter bees being reared in September.!

The link below, from Bee Source, is a very interesting article that lays out the math of this whole process. I hope you will read it and then make decisions to act and test and treat your bees for mites during this critical time for bees. Your winter preps start now!
