On warmer windless days, check and/or add feed--- also do any winter varroa mite treatments, before the late winter brood increase commences.

Just wanted to tell you that I took the eCornell Beekeeping Essentials self-paced course. The Author of the course is Emma Walters and she is quite knowledgeable about beekeeping. This self-paced course contains over a dozen modules on all aspects of beekeeping beginning with how to keep the smoker lit, inspecting colonies both general and for diseases and touches upon most things beekeepers will be faced with during the entire annual cycle. The modules contained videos and quizzes to assess one progress. The course cost \$299 less a 10% discount if you belong to a beekeeping club like LIBC. This course is recommended for folks with 1-3 years of beekeeping experience. Give

Hey Beeks!

We have heard some comments from our members about Masks, Vaccination and COVID testing concerning our meetings and the upcoming Holiday Party. With the

colder weather, we will be having our events inside. So, moving forward we are thinking about the safety and wellbeing of all our members in this era of COVID. We discussed options at our November board meeting that allow us to safely meet inside, which are being vaccinated, wearing a mask, and/or being tested prior to events. We don't want to be the police! It is not the board's desire to check vaccination cards, or see a negative test within 72 hours of the event like they do in NYC at all restaurants and Broadway shows. So, we are asking for an increased level of awareness and understanding of the risk to our members, but especially older members and those who have underlying conditions putting them at a higher risk if they contract COVID. We need our members to understand that the board is walking a fine line between caution and the individual rights of our members. We don't want to offend or alienate anyone over this issue. But it would be irresponsible for the board to not to address the situation of life during COVID. We sincerely thank you for understanding about this extremely sensitive situation.

The Buzz for Nov. 8th 2021

Hello there, and what's *Buzzing*?

Bees have been around for quite some time and consequently have been featured in culture, myth, and folklore worldwide for thousands of years. Honey and beeswax have been essential resources for humans since the

Mesolithic period (s. 7–10th century BC).

As a result, humans' relationship with bees – particularly honey bees – has ranged from encounters with wild bees (both prehistorically and in the present) to keeping them agriculturally. Bees themselves were often characterized as magically-imbued creatures and their honey as a divine gift. The third edition of *The Buzz*, therefore, is dedicated to bees in pop culture.

The metaphor of bee communities as a model of human society occurs early on in the works of Aristotle, Plato, and **Seneca**. This metaphor continued through the ages in the works of **Shakespeare** and Bernard Mandeville's "Fable of the Bees". Tolstoy similarly compares human society to a community of bees in War and Peace. Jean-Baptiste Simon titled his work of apiculture Le gouvernement admirable, ou, la république des abeilles (Paris, 1740) which translates to "The Admirable Government: Or, The Republic Of Bees And The Means Of Deriving Great Benefit From It."

Bees have entered our daily lives even more than one would

think not only in modern art but also with names like Austèja (Lithuanian name derived from an ancient bee goddess.), Erlea (Basque), and Melissa (Greek, derived from meli meaning honey) – which all mean bee in one way or another.


