Hello All,

Welcome to beekeeping season 2022. Wishing everyone lots of luck maintaining healthy and thriving colonies this year.

Similar to many of you that come to the meetings, I'm anxious about keeping all of my colonies moving in the right direction. My advice to everyone is to come to all the meetings and learn from our experts that have been successful for many years.

Of course, checking for mites, treating when necessary and with the appropriate medicine and making sure the bees have just enough room to grow and expand during this season is critical. It's also critical to work slowly and gently with the frames of bees.

Most newbies are afraid of stings, which is normal. Wear protective clothing but try to avoid wearing bulky gloves. Until you're on a successful routine check your bees often (every week or 10-14 days). Come to the sessions at the teaching apiary where you will learn and see at the same time.

Get a magazine subscription to Bee Culture and American Bee Journal to see what is going on in the industry and what the scientists are working on. (Membership in our club entitles you to some discounted subscriptions when you apply.) Most of all enjoy the hobby and learn how to keep your bees healthy and productive.
